## **Reception class**

In Reception Class we follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework. The Early Years Foundation Stage Framework is based upon four themes:

- A Unique Child developing resilient, capable, confident and self assured individuals
- Positive Relationships supporting the children in becoming strong and independent self assured individuals
- Enabling Environments where opportunities respond to individual needs and there is a strong partnership between practitioners and parents/carers
- Learning and Development acknowledging that children learn in different ways and at different rates

#### Phonics and reading

Systematic synthetic daily phonics is taught following the Read Write Inc Programme throughout Early Years and Key Stage 1. Pupils are grouped according to ability across the year groups. Progress is tracked throughout the year by the early reading and phonics lead and groupings are adjusted accordingly. Pupils in Year 1 have a National Phonics Screening Test in June.

When pupils complete the Read Write Inc phonics programme they begin 'No-nonsense spelling'. This programme is taught throughout Key Stage 2.

#### Reading

We use the Read Write Inc reading scheme throughout Early Years and Key Stage 1 where books are fully decodable and correlate with where the child is up to in the scheme. When ready, children are sent home two books which are matched to their reading level from Read, Write, Inc. and a book to read for pleasure with an adult, which will be from the school library.







## **Our School Day**

#### **Times**

Classroom doors open 8.45am Gates Close/Registration 9.00am

Lunch 12.00pm – 1.00pm

End of School Day 3.15pm

The school gate will be opened from 8.40am and the classroom doors will be opened at 8.45am so children can settle into class.

#### <u>Lunchtime</u>

Under the government's Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) scheme, children are entitled to a free school meal from Reception class until the end of Year 2. If you do not wish for your child to have a school meal they may bring a packed lunch.

Local Kitchen are our school meal provider. The meals offered meet nutritional standards and are prepared from fresh daily. Meals are cooked on site and we offer a daily choice of two hot meal choices or a jacket potato with a choice of fillings or a sandwich lunch. A choice of deserts, including fresh fruit, are also available. Parents are asked to pre-order their child's meal selection using an ordering website.

If your child has any intolerances or allergies, please ensure you inform school and we will work alongside you to ensure your child's dietary needs are suitably met.

## **Enrichment and Extra-Curricular Clubs**

At St Jude's we offer a wide range of enrichment and extra-curricular activities. In recent years, our Early Years children have had visits from Curious Critters, a Pirate (DanTastic Education) and have visited Smithills Farm.

Each term St Jude's offer a wide selection of extra-curricular clubs such as; multi-sports, choir, dance, Lego, rugby, reading and art.

## **Wraparound Care**

Breakfast Club 7.45am – 8.45am After School Club 3.15pm – 5.15pm

St Jude's offers morning and/or after school wraparound care. Our Breakfast Club opens at 7.45am. Children are provided with a breakfast consisting of toast, cereal, fruit, milk and a drink. The cost is £4.50 per session.

Our After School Club runs from the end of the school day and children are provided with a snack and a drink. Our After School Club is open until 5.15pm. The cost is £7.00 per session.





## **School Uniform**

Our school uniform proudly identifies St Jude's pupils. The school tartan and 'badged' components of the uniform are available from **Slaters** and **AC Sports**. To ensure cost is kept to a minimum, the majority of our uniform; polo shirts, trousers, skirts and shorts, can all be bought from supermarkets or children's clothing shops.

Prior to your child starting St Jude's you will be given information regarding our uniform standards and a comprehensive list of what uniform and PE kit will be needed.

## Applying for a Place at St.Jude's

#### Applying for a place in Reception

If your child was born between 1st September 2021 and 31st August 2022, they will start Reception class at the start of the new school year in September 2026. Applications for a place in Reception Class in a Wigan Primary school are made through the Wigan Council online application service -
