Listening Calendar:

Listening to different genres of music is a regular activity. Listening to music increases happiness, strengthens learning and generally improves mental well-being. The Listening Calendar brings together interesting facts related to the songs and the composer of each song.

Singing is key to developing musicianship and is a core part of the music curriculum at St Jude's. In addition to dedicated curriculum singing time, children sing in assembly, as whole school or in year groups and perform at significant events throughout the school year. Children regularly use their voices as a vehicle for composition and are encouraged to develop vocal confidence as they progress through the music curriculum. Children in KS2 have the opportunity to sing in the school choir to further develop vocal skills and part-singing through regular performances in school and in the local community.
